ABOUT BAYSHORE

Bayshore is quietly nestled in the picturesque pines and sprawling live oaks of Fairhope, Alabama. What began with 20 students in 2002 has now grown to more than 450 students in preschool through the twelfth grade. Bayshore offers a distinctly classical and definitively Christian education to more than 300 families representing over 50 different churches and 10 evangelical denominations across greater Baldwin County.

Our mission is to graduate students with a biblical worldview who will inspire, impact, and serve their communities. Our students will be critical thinkers who are academically and spiritually prepared for college and their life's calling. They will be defenders of the Christian faith and able to exquisitely articulate that defense. They will be lovers of whatsoever things are true, honest, just, pure, lovely, and virtuous.

LOGIC & RHETORIC SCHOOL FACULTY

The student to faculty ratio is 9:1, and the average class size is 18. Many of our faculty members hold a Master's degree or higher. Our Logic & Rhetoric teachers are subject experts and hold degrees in their fields.

ACCREDITATION

Bayshore Christian School has been a member of the Association of Classical Christian Schools since 2004 and has been nationally accredited by the Association of Classical Christian Schools since 2015.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Students are selectively admitted after demonstrating grade-level competency on the BCS Placement Test in reading comprehension, composition, and math. Additionally, at least one parent must be a professing Christian. All incoming families are interviewed by the Head of School.

NATIONAL MERIT SEMIFINALISTS

Bayshore Christian School has produced four National Merit Semifinalists and one National Merit Finalist in its short history.

THE BAYSHORE DISTINCTIVE

Bayshore's classical approach to education follows the natural development of a student's intellect. Beginning with the "grammar" level by presenting the basic facts and principles of learning, then progressing to the "logic" level of ordering information, classical education matures in the "rhetoric" stage where students learn to think critically, integrate information, and communicate effectively.

Foreign Language: Latin instruction is standard in 7th and 8th grade. In 9th through 12th grade, students may choose from Advanced Latin, Spanish, or French courses to fulfill the two consecutive foreign language credit requirement.

Literature: Students read original source material. Reading, prose, and poetry taught in Literature classes are integrated with the time period being taught in History, Bible, and Theology classes.

Senior Thesis: As the culmination of training in Rhetoric, 11th and 12th grade students research and compose a persuasive thesis, defend their position before an academic panel, and present their findings in a public forum. The Senior Thesis is the capstone of a Bayshore Education.

Grand Tour: Seniors travel abroad to countries such as Israel, Greece, and Italy making concrete connections with their study of antiquity and the Bible. These experiences create a cultural awareness that solidifies the mission of the church throughout history.
